Responsibilities include effective planning and programming, documentation of teaching and learning programs, collaboration with the Junior Primary team, and participation in professional development activities.

In addition to your teaching responsibilities, you will contribute to the broader school community by attending staff meetings, participating in extracurricular events, and maintaining open communication with students, parents, and fellow staff members. You will demonstrate a commitment to the values and ethos of the College, fostering positive relationships and serving as a role model for students and colleagues alike.

- Document and evaluate teaching and learning programs, ensuring alignment with College and curriculum requirements.

- Participate in professional development activities to enhance teaching skills and knowledge.
- Attend staff meetings and contribute to the wider school community through involvement in extracurricular activities and events.

- Current registration with the Teachers Registration Board of Western Australia.

- Ability to work collaboratively as part of a team, demonstrating flexibility and adaptability in a dynamic educational environment.

- Experience with Compass database for student information management.
