FROM THE College Principal

At the start of 2024, we were excited to launch the new Strategic Plan "Reach for our Purpose 2024-2029' to all College community members. With this came our new Crest and branding. It was so pleasing to note the community's acceptance and pleasure when the vision was launched. Thank you to the staff teams and to all who worked on the improvements to achieve an excellent result.

This year has been one of the vision manifesting!

We engaged the reputable Architectural Firm, Architectus, to work with us to deliver a first-rate master capital works plan by mid-year. The flythrough version of this plan can be viewed on our new look website, and it is inspiring! It will likely take another 15 years to build all the capital works envisioned, but the College now has an incredibly strong and purposeful blueprint. Students will greatly benefit from all that is being prepared to continuously improve our facilities and resources.

We welcomed, due to increased demand for enrolments, additional students in our Year 5 extra stream, implemented mid-this year. This action has created 4 streams for both Year 5 and 6 going forward in our primary school. Students will benefit from the work our talented teachers are doing to provide the best preparation for the rigours of secondary education. Due to increasing enquiries, we also made the decision to increase Year 7 enrolment places from 128 to 180 places from Year 7, 2025 onwards. Our school is growing. It is extraordinary for all of us to be experiencing this wave of increase. We were amazed at the number of guests (approximately 1700) who attended our inaugural Twilight Open evening. What a fun night that was and I was so proud of our staff and students as they showcased their quality work. I thank the staff team for their dedication and 'can do' attitude. Continuous improvement breeds momentum. I thank our Chairman. Grant Botha and our Board members for their committed support.

This year was also the ten-year anniversary of the renowned Football program at the College, and we acknowledge the excellent work of our coaches, Director of Football, and our talented student sportsmen and sportswomen.

Several Drama productions and music concerts graced the stage once again, and the 2024 Art Exhibition was even better than last year. It was extremely difficult for me to choose the Principal's Award, given the many talented pieces on display.

Another major project initiated this year was the upgrade of our technology devices for teaching and learning. In partnership with Microsoft, our College will benefit from providing our secondary students with the best 21st-century learning devices to support the learning complexities of a quality secondary education. Our primary students will continue to be well supplied with College devices suited to their age groups and learning requirements.

As the year came to a close and our delightful College graduates donned their robes to enjoy an incredible ceremony at the performing arts centre in Mandurah, we reflected on the remarkable year that was 2024. We look forward to our soon to be constructed Amphitheatre and prayer garden on College grounds. Construction for this feature commenced in December this year and was due for completion by January 2025. In addition, our new secondary building which began construction in 2024 is scheduled to be completed by April of 2025.





STUDENTS Non - Attendance

If a student is absent from a teaching instruction day and there has been no reasonable explanation provided by a parent or guardian, a mobile text message is sent to the parent or guardian on the day of the absence, asking them to provide a reason.


If no response is received, an email is sent to the parent/guardian via COMPASS, advising of the student's absence from the College requesting an explanation. If an email response has not been received regarding the unresolved absence, a letter is posted home asking for an explanation (See Daily SMS Procedure & Weekly Absentee Follow-up Procedure).

This will remain an unresolved absence until an explanation is provided by the parent or Guardian.

If a student is absent for a significant amount of school with no reasonable explanation, Student Services will notify the Deputy Head of Primary (Wellbeing) and Head of Primary or the Deputy Head of Secondary (Wellbeing), Year Manager (Secondary) and the Head of Secondary.


SCBC Income 2024

College Expenditure













Year 5 NAPLAN Subject Averages
